Our first ever joint round table

The Research Ethics and Governance Unit (REGU) has been hosting an Ethics and Governance round table twice a year for over 10 years. This is a valuable networking meeting that brings together Ethics Officers and Research Governance Officers from across the state to discuss issues and share ideas and experience.

For the first time we expanded the round table and invited Clinical Trials NSW to co-host the event.

In the morning we held separate sessions for CTUM and EGOs.

After morning tea everyone came together for some structured networking sessions. Based off of a successful 'birds of a feather' session held in the first round table of the year, a combined 'birds of a

feather' session was again held. Lots of laughs and fun was had as everyone got to put faces to names, make connections and find out what would happen if our colleagues won the lotto over the weekend (hint: there were a few tropical islands being purchased).

In the afternoon, a presentation on decentralised clinical trials led to the EGOs and CTUM working together to provide a gap analysis. There were many great ideas and responses provided, which are currently being looked at and an update will be provided on what will be done with this information in the near future.

Feedback from the day was overwhelmingly positive with attendees finding value in policy and office updates, the structured networking opportunities and meeting expectations being met.

The REGU will be evaluating the feedback from the survey to determine if a combined event would again be held with the Clinical Trials NSW, a different group or if feedback shows that this was such a popular event that we can't wait to hold another in 2023!
