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### NSW Health and Medical Research Sponsorship Program

#### Applications are now open

To support this, the Office for Health and Medical Research is offering sponsorship of up to \$20,000 for eligible conferences or events in NSW. Sponsorship is available for an event being held face to face, virtually or as a hybrid.

The Program is designed to support medical research institutes, peak and professional bodies, not-for-profits and non-government organisations that may not have access to other sources of sponsorship funding.


#### Joint Roundtable Feedback
