Updating the Incorrect Owner on an ETH/STE Application

The REGIS team has seen an increase in calls to the REGIS Technical Helpdesk (F1) for users requesting that the incorrect Owner of an Ethics or Site application be changed to the Coordinating Principal Investigator (CPI) or Principal Investigator (PI) as appropriate. This is not a technical issue and can be easily and quickly updated by the reviewing Research Office or REGIS team.

When the Research Office should be contacted: When the application is in any status other than 'In Progress'.

When the REGIS team should be contacted: When an application is in the status of 'In Progress'.
