

#### SWSLHD - We are all in this together!

Research is more than just a process to us at South Western Sydney Local Health District (SWSLHD). Aligned with the *motto* of *'Leading Care, Healthier communities'* at SWSLHD, we truly believe that cutting-edge research will lead to healthier communities. At the SWSLHD Research Directorate, we have initiated a wider outreach program where we are staying in touch with our researchers continuously.

Firstly, in collaboration with the Development Support Unit we have organised a four-part workshop series to provide key information to our researchers regarding major aspects of ethics and governance requirements for the applications. This includes information ranging from submission of applications, to essentials of complex contracts/agreements. The information about our workshops is available on our website. The workshops will continue to run on a monthly basis with a new series of topics soon to be released. So far the workshops have been well attended.

Secondly, we have initiated contribution to the SWSLHD Research Directorate's Newsletter. The primary objective is to provide concise information to our researchers *via* the 'summary', which is centered on the current issues that we have seen in multiple applications. This can be as simple as reminding the researchers not to forget to complete the CPI details on the SSA form while submitting their applications to us!

Thirdly, we are working closely with SWSLHD's Clinical Trials Support Unit (CTSU) to allow us to identify, discuss and resolve critical issues on a regular basis. This also ensures a streamlined approach to implementing changes in policy or requirements from various stakeholders. Representatives from the Ethics and Governance unit attend the monthly Clinical Trial Coordinators meeting to keep the communication lines open.

Last but not least, we are always available *via* phone, emails or Microsoft Teams and can assist virtually with queries including problem solving by screen sharing.
