CiTRoS – Boosting Insights into the Clinical Trials Workforce

clinical trialsNSW is developing CiTRoS – the Clinical Trial Register of Staff - to improve access to information about the clinical trial workforce. CiTRoS will capture workforce statistics that provide current and detailed workforce data. This data will complement the National Clinical Trial Governance Framework requirements and be a reference for future initiatives to enhance clinical trials workforce capability and capacity.

REGIS Case Study: External HREC Progress Report

Milestone management is a process familiar to those using REGIS, and one I've been responsible for within the research office where I work. I'm Emily, and if you've recently reached out to the REGIS Support team via email, chances are you've corresponded with me. While I'm currently on a secondment with the REGIS Support team, my primary role remains within the Research Ethics and Governance Office of Western Sydney Local Health District.

Joining the REGIS team has given me a deeper understanding of the complexities involved in milestone management, particularly through observing and responding to the emails sent by stakeholders. Accurate milestone creation is paramount for transparent tracking of research progress, findings, and outcomes. However, inaccuracies in milestone creation can disrupt workflows, especially in studies involving multiple sites within REGIS.

In this case report, I'm excited to delve into a specific issue faced by REGIS users regarding the creation of milestones for sites with Human Research Ethics Committees (HRECs) external to REGIS.



The case in question was received as an email from a Local Health District Research Office who identified themselves as the lead site among three of a study, their query was that they could not work out why there was duplicate milestones in the decision section for the same year for their site and they also requested that REGIS Support team delete a decision for a milestone that had been acknowledge by their office.

During the investigation into how this error occurred it was found that the first milestone and one the Research Office wanted deleted was created by one of the non-lead sites. On this occasion, upon completion of that milestone the decision was then created for all sites to review. Consequently, the lead site then submitted an additional external HREC annual report milestone which led to two milestones being created for all three sites to make a decision on.

The findings of this investigation were reported back to the Research Office and notified them that when decisions with outcomes are created in REGIS there is no function in REGIS to delete the acknowledged decision.

This case underscores the risk of workflow disruptions due to unnecessary milestone creation in REGIS and can occur with any process in REGIS. The system operates on an expected workflow, where the lead site generates the milestone for the CPI (Coordinating Principal Investigator) to submit the report on behalf of all sites involved in the study. Any deviation from this process can lead to situations like the one described in this report.
