### Microsoft Outlook Issue: New Outlook Issue is not a REGIS Issue

There has been a recently identified incompatibility issue with Microsoft Outlook, with a few specific file type extensions not being able to be opened in the "New Outlook". Please be advised that **this is not a REGIS technical issue**, or a **REGIS system issue**.



Microsoft is addressing this issue by rolling out an update which will allow users to open file types, such as msg and others in the "New Outlook". In the meantime, users are advised to continue using the older Outlook until this update occurs.

### RFGIS: Inactive HOD Positions and How to Re-Activate

The eHealth REGIS team has received a number of inquiries that HOD positions are inactive, meaning these HODs are unable to be selected in the STE application to provide support. While there are legitimate reasons for these positions to be inactive, we are seeing some examples where inactive positions have no expiry date (expiry dates exist when positions have been made inactive).

While the eHealth REGIS team further investigates this, we have created a document to assist you with steps on how to re-activate HOD positions that you believe should be active.
