### Farewell Dr Rob Loblay

#### Dear colleagues,

I want to take a moment to acknowledge the extraordinary contribution of Dr Rob Loblay as he steps down as Chair of RPAH HREC after 30 years. I want to publicly extend my deepest gratitude for the remarkable dedication and leadership he has shown, not just to the committee that he has led, but to the endeavour of ethics review across NSW Health and Australia more broadly.

Dr. Loblay became Chair of the Sydney Local Health District Human Research Ethics Committee RPAH Zone in 1995. He also held the position of Chair of the RPAH Ethics of Clinical Practice Subcommittee since 1998 and convener of the RPAH Clinical Ethics Advisory Committee since 2001. His contributions in these roles have been fundamental in shaping and upholding the ethical standards for clinical practice and medical research across the Sydney Local Health District and across NSW and beyond.

Under Dr. Loblay's leadership, the RPAH HREC and its three sub-committees, have navigated the evolving landscape of medical research, particularly the complex ethical issues arising in clinical trials, emerging technologies, and patient rights. His leadership has been characterised by a deep commitment to safeguarding the welfare of research participants, promoting transparency in research practices, and ensuring that ethical considerations are integral to the design and conduct of research and clinical practice.



Dr. Loblay's role as Chair has also involved significant contributions to the development of ethical guidelines and protocols at both the state and national levels. Notably, was his work towards developing national ethical guidelines for the NHMRC Australian Health Ethics Committee; his work on the NHMRC Harmonisation of Multicentre Ethics Review (HoMER) steering group and National Ethics Application Form (NEAF) review committee, where he has contributed to streamlining the ethical review process across Australia, making it more efficient while maintaining rigorous ethical standards. This was a task that required not only profound knowledge of ethical principles but also the ability to foster collaboration among diverse stakeholders in the research community. This work facilitated harmonisation of ethical review processes and the conduct of multi-centre studies. These contributions have had a lasting impact on the governance of medical research in Australia.

I want to personally thank Rob for the wisdom that he has provided to many of the working groups and roundtables that the OHMR has conducted – his views have been invaluable to our shaping of the research environment. His guidance has not only steered his HREC through numerous challenging projects and emerging developments in trial design but has also ensured a legacy of research integrity and excellence that will undoubtedly endure for years to come. The ethics and scientific review process is essential to high quality and ethical research being conducted in our public health system and it is the selfless contribution of people such as Rob who make it possible.

It has been a genuine pleasure to work with Rob and benefit from his thinking and views. I will greatly miss his presence as will his colleagues both at RPAH and across NSW.
