REGIS/NOSS Survey Responses



Take this example where we asked the exact same question of our Research Offices and Researchers.

"In your opinion, should a project registration be a minimum data set form (less questions) OR a researcher support tool that helps researchers identify critical decision points such as if a study is a clinical trial or clinical research"

Research Offices sit majority in the support tool camp where Researchers are currently sitting in the minimum dataset camp.
